## Gouldian Finch Update



During the last few months our finches have been busy little birds. Both aviaries are abuzz with nesting and fledging behaviour and we wait for the breeding season to come to a close before our next release.

As some of you will remember, a sighting last year by members of the Cumberland Bird Club in an area to the north of the Reserve remains unverified, so we are still unsure whether or not there are some birds from earlier releases living in the wild. It is, after all, a

big country out there! However, the reintroduction programme continues this year, with a big release of up to 100 birds planned for early July.

We are extremely grateful to Maroochy vet, Dr Brendan Barker, who is donating health tested birds for the release, and these are due to hop on a flight to Cairns in the next couple of weeks to join our own stock. We are lucky indeed that Julie Deleyev, warden last year, will be coming back to assist with the banding

and release of the birds, and we also have assistance from visiting researcher from Ireland, Dr Fintan Bracken. It promises to be an exciting few weeks.

As in previous years, we encourage all members of the Foundation and the local community to be especially vigilant and phone the Visitor Centre if any sightings are suspected. We will follow up on all leads! If any members would like to be part of the post release monitoring, please speak to Tim or Lisa. Tel: 4093 2514.

## Wildlife Report

As the dry season progresses, increasing numbers of waterbirds are making the Mareeba Tropical Savanna and Wetland Reserve their home. Cotton Pygmy-Geese (*Nettapus coromandelianus*) are abundant, with a record count for the season so far of 31 individuals on Clancy's Lagoon at the one time. With striking white windows on the wing, the males are busily and noisily chasing each other around the lilies.

A regular sight on the lagoon is the first of our resident Freshwater Crocodiles (*Crocodylus johnstoni*). Each morning we spot it sunning itself on one of our tern nesting platforms at the northern end of the lagoon and estimate it to be just over a

metre in length. This individual will not be alone for long as we hope to release a number of others into the Lagoon this year.

Many visitors are getting good views of the Scarlet Honeyeater (*Myzomela sanguinolenta*) along with many other nectar feeders feeding from the flowers of the Broad-leafed Melaleuca (*Melaleuca viridiflora*). Other interesting sightings include an Australian Bustard (*Ardeotis australis*), huge flocks of Red-tailed Black Cockatoos (*Calyptorhynchus magnificus*) going south in the mornings and heading north in the evenings and increasing numbers of Brolga (*Grus rubicundus*) and Sarus Crane (*Grus antigone*).

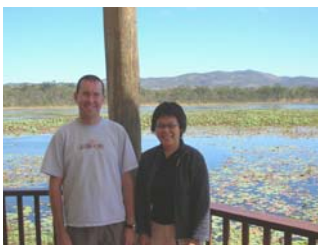
Along with the many birds seen on our Twilight Safari tour, participants are also getting up close to an Agile Wallaby (*Macropus agilis*) who, drawn to the Visitor Centre deck by the smell of wine and cheese, has become a regular providing many photo opportunities.

Visitors are also getting many photo opportunities with the resident Emus (*Dromaius Novaehollandiae*). With the adult male sitting on eggs, the other three have made the area between the Visitor Centre, the new Jabiru Camp and the release pen their home territory. Ever curious, staff and volunteers have been supervised intensely while going about their daily duties!

## Members' News

**Build your own Nest Box.** This has been scheduled for the school holidays to particularly encourage our younger members to participate. All will leave with their own nest box to put up in their garden. Cost for the morning to include materials \$20, children \$11, non members \$25. It is essential that you pre-book this event as soon

as possible.

**Waterbird surveys** will run throughout the year as part of our monitoring on the Reserve and will be coordinated by wardens Tim and Lisa, themselves experienced birders. Please bring your own binoculars and meet at the Visitor Centre. This is a members only activity, and there is no cost. Remember however that accommodation in Jabiru Camp can be booked for the night before to avoid that early start!

**Stargazing** Enjoy the cloudless skies of winter and join us for an evening bbq to be followed by an introduction to the stars

with Tim Daniel of Wilderness Expeditions. Cost to members \$25pp to include food and drinks. RSVP is essential.

**Bird Banding** We offer our members the chance to learn more about this technique, and how to interpret the bands. Free to members and small group only, so book your spot early!
